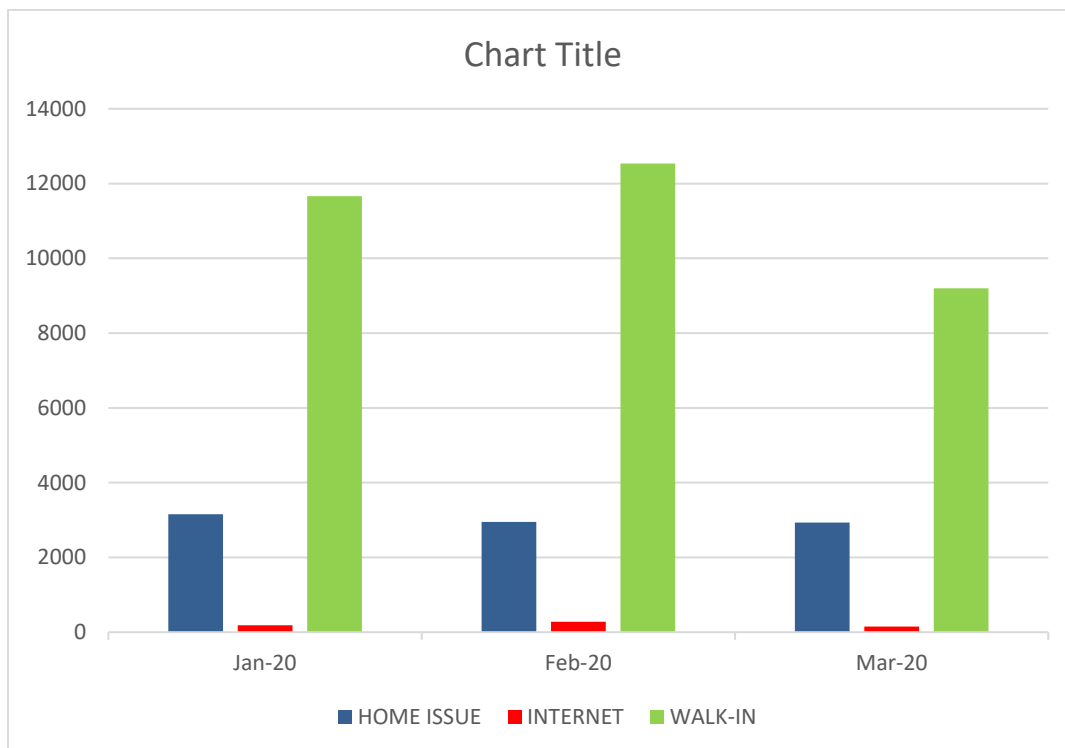

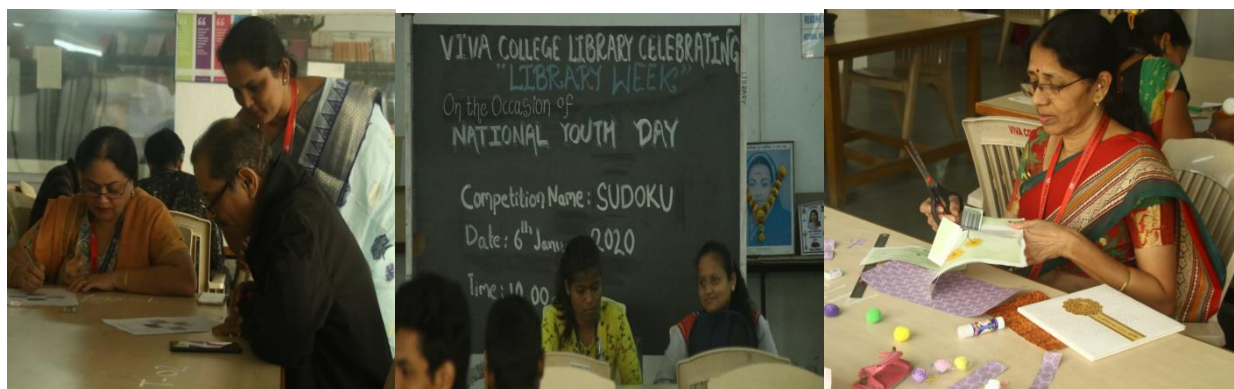

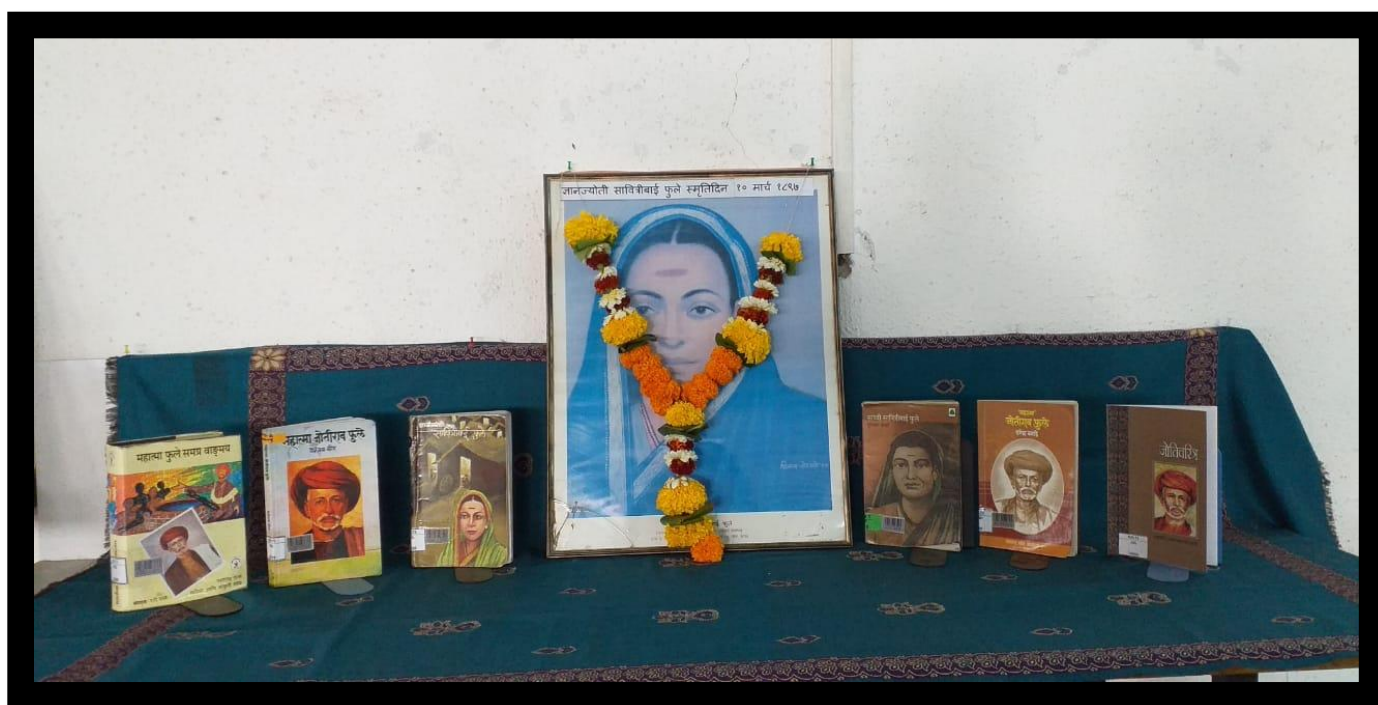


Book Display
