



This online exhibition PDF circulates among Students Faculty members and all staff of the VIVA College.




# "International yoga day"

To promote peace and harmony 21 June is declared as "International yoga day" on this occasion VIVA College Library celebrated International yoga day and displayed online books on yoga.






#### "Vachan Prerana Din"

The event was well received and appreciated by a lot of students and faculty members.






## "Book Display"
